

FEATURE ARTICLE

1915 SF Touring Sedan





The Studebaker brothers were the entrepreneurs of the transportation word from the time they came to America at the port of Philadelphia on September 1, 1736, since that date the brother's, sons and grandsons played a major part in the advancement of transportation in America. From wagons for farm need and military use to the cover wagon of the 1700's through the 1800's designing carriages for the wealthy citizens of America as the Industrial Revolution spread through Europe into America. The discovery of Pneumatic Tires patented by a veterinarian in Scotland, Robert William Thomson 1884 for bicycles. Seven years later André Michelin and his brother Edouard developed a rubber tire which was not durable when driven over rough terrain as it broke down. Philip Strauss invented the combination tire and air-filled inner tube in 1911 that pneumatic tires could be used on automobiles with success. In France Louis-Rene and Emile Levassor invented the world's largest-ever transmission system with 3-speed sliding mesh transmission in 1894 and used in the early 1900's model cars.

In Europe and America the results of the Industrial revolution brought new and diverse changes to all aspects of the industrial world. It seems reasonable that every aspic of the development of the car of the future was through trial and error as I am sure was the conversation in the board room at South Bend, Indiana as ideas were passed around as they put ideas into reality when designing the SF Touring Car. The results of the exchange of ideas became a reality as the SF Touring Car was rolled out in South Bend, Indiana at the Studebaker Company in 1915.

(The 1915 SF Touring Car was built with these and many other inventive ideas from entrepreneurs in the motor vehicle industry as the SF Touring Car had a 192,4 cu. In L-head inline four-cylinder engine with a three-speed selective sliding-gear transmission, solid front and full-floating rear axis with full-elliptical leaf-spring front and rea suspension and rear wheel external-contracting brakes. Wheelbase of 108.e inches.)
