On another note, I received some great news the day after La Palma. My late father, Landy Scott, was one of the inaugural inductees into the Badger Midget Auto Racing's Hall of Fame. Some of you might remember seeing Landy's midget at the 2014 La Palma Meet and the Los Angeles' Chapter's Winter Meet that same year. The Mighty Roar of Midget Auto Racing echoing through Wisconsin has been a tradition since 1934. Operating within the state since 1936, the Badger Midget Auto Racing Association (BMARA) and its members, past and present, have played an important role in the development of the most exciting form of auto racing in America. Landy raced for fifteen years, including nine as the organization's president. How does that tie into the Studebaker Drivers Club, you ask? Well, his Kurtis Kraft Midget Racer was powered by a Studebaker Champion engine, which he drove to the Badger Championship in 1947. Landy was always a Studebaker man, but his racing career and his success made him a Studebaker die-hard.

Landy's midget was on display at the **Studebaker National Museum** in South Bend for nine years before being moved closer to "home" to the **Wisconsin Automotive Museum** in Hartford, Wisconsin, where it proudly sits today.

Last month I finally got around to introducing you to GroupWorks, well, now it's time to announce its demise.

#### **GroupWorks Cancels Service**

Ladies and gentlemen of the SDC family, yesterday we received the sudden notice that GroupWorks will go dark in about 30 days. You may also receive a message directly from Grouper and Groupworks announcing this disappointing change to a tool we were just getting used to.

The GroupWorks product has existed for over seven years and has thousands of users. Although GroupWorks was free for our use, the parent company has notified us that the costs of maintaining the platform for all clubs on the system have continuously and significantly increased. Element3, now called Grouper, has told us it has become infeasible to continue operating the platform at the current expense.

How does this affect the Studebaker Drivers Club? Turning Wheels, the SDC Forums, and websites will see no changes. Those will run business as usual. Only GroupWorks will be impacted. We will have no access to GroupWorks after June 21, 2024.

Thank you for giving me this opportunity to work with the members; I met many of you, made some new friends, and learned a lot about the organization as we developed the system. I believe we can find an alternative, so stay tuned.
